Mother's Day Visit

It was wonderful to see so many mothers and special ladies here on Friday afternoon. Thank you to the mums who took other kids under their wings who didn't have a mum able to come.

I know these days are incredibly tricky for working parents to attend. We know this can be tricky on the students.

Father's Day and Grandparents Day

We will have a father's special day on the Friday leading into Father's Day (Friday the 30th of August). Grandparents Day will be on Friday the 8th of November this year.

With all our special days, if your child doesn't have a father or grandparent in their life, we would love for someone to step in for them (it can be their mother on Father's Day or a special person in their life). It is about sharing their school life with them.

Second-hand uniform

Brylee has worked hard the last couple of weeks to get the second-hand uniform all cleaned and hanging up on racks in the Brekky Club Room. If you are after some extra uniform, please come and see Brylee. If you have some uniforms that your child has grown out of, please bring it into the office and we will add it to our racks.

Lost Uniform

All uniform that is found around the school that has a name on it will be returned to the student. If the uniform doesn't have a name on it, we wash it up and add it to the second-hand uniform racks. It makes everyone's job so much easier when the uniform is labelled.

Winter is coming

As we don't have a set school uniform jacket, (there is a fleecy jacket available to purchase) I am happy for the students to wear other jackets in the playground, my preference is that the jacket is navy. Wearing an oodie or a blanket is not appropriate at school. It needs to be a jacket. While they are in the classrooms they must be in school uniform.

Student behaviour

Just as we need to teach the students how to read, write and do maths, we also need to teach the students how to get along, when it is ok to do some things and when it is not, how to ask for help or how to tell someone to stop. We have weekly lessons in each of the classrooms to help their understanding, because it is not easy learning all these socially acceptable rules.

I have been working with the whole staff to formalise our responses to student behaviour. We still have some work to do; I shared with School Council recently the work that we have been undertaking.


Reset Steps

We know that sometimes the students just need a reminder to get on with their work (just as we do as adults) and this is enough for them to get back on track. Sometimes we need to move them away from the distraction (or from distracting others) and that will get them on track again. There are times when they need assistance to refocus and then there are times when they need a break from the classroom before they are able to learn.




This is where our reset steps come in.

It is only when we need to use these regularly with a student that we will contact the parents to let them know. Everyone is allowed to have an off day or to not be focused.



School Values

Our school values are Be Safe, Be Respectful and Be a Learner. It can be tricky to know what is meant by these, everyone has a different opinion. To help with understanding, we have given five examples for each of the values.




Behaviour Triangle – there are three aspects to the Triangle:

Behaviours – The behaviour triangle outlines the desired behaviours, the behaviours that are managed in the classroom by the teacher (Tier 1), the behaviours that Brylee (social worker) and Lisa (assistant principal) manage in the classroom or outside the classroom (Tier 2) and the behaviours that require my attention (Tier 3) – which usually involve sending the student home (suspension).

Teacher and ES strategies – work that can be done in the classrooms to encourage the desired behaviours, ways of stopping the behaviour before it becomes bigger and ways of calming the situation.

Leadership strategies – plans and documentation to support the student if the behaviour is regular, strategies when the student is heightened and processes if the behaviour is Tier 3.



Consistent consequences

Our next step is to ensure that consistent consequences are given, no matter who is giving them.

Staff Code of Conduct

Not only are we focusing on the behaviour of the students, we have focused on our own behaviour. All staff within the Department of Education must abide by the Code of Conduct for Victorian Public Sector Employees. This is made available to all staff to read and follow.

Statement of Values and School Philosophy

Our school's Statement of Values and School Philosophy policy outlines the values of our school community, students, staff and their families, whilst explaining the vision, mission and objectives of our school. We encourage all of our families to read the policy and exhibit the same behaviours that we emphasise are important to our students. 
What's on in Grade 1/2


