Dear Parents/Carers,

A massive thank you to each and every parent who has supported our school this term, in total we have raised approximately \$6000. This is absolutely amazing for the size of our school. I know we have asked a lot of you all this term; normally we try to space out our fundraising. When I set the Slime Fun Run and Easter raffle, we had no plans of doing the hot cross bun orders. We wanted the slime to be when the weather was still nice. The hot cross bun opportunity came out of nowhere; in fact, in the past, I have tried to have this style of hot cross bun order, but we have always been overlooked.

For the remainder of the year, we have just our annual fundraising events; Mother's Day stall, Scholastic Book Fair, Father's Day stall, Christmas raffle, and hot chocolates (instead of icy poles).

Borrowed uniform

If we sent your child home in some of the spare uniform after the slime day, please send it back after the holidays so we have it available the next time students need uniform.

If you have some uniform that your child is no longer wearing (too small), we'd love to take it off your hands.

Camps

Over the holidays I will be finalising the camp sleeping arrangements and activity groups for the Grade 3s and 4s (the 5/6 camp is altogether the whole time). I appreciate that not knowing exactly which group they are in is going to be tricky for some students; all students have written down two students they would be happy to be in a room with, I am taking this into account. I will do everything I can for students to be with at least one student they have chosen.

Grade 3 and 4 camp – please bring all medication in on **Monday the 24th**, so it can all be organised before the camp morning. Handing it in on the morning is incredibly stressful, which can add to mistakes happening.

Grade 5 and 6 camp – please bring all medication in on Friday the 28th; we are leaving at 7.30am sharp on the Monday morning (May 1st). Again, I want to avoid the need to rush the medication collection.

Attitude to School Survey

In Term 2 the DET conduct a survey with all Grade 4 - 6 students on how they feel at school, their attitude towards learning, their parents' attitude towards school, their friendships and bullying. The DET regard the results of this survey incredibly important - they know the importance of students being happy and prepared to give things a go. As this survey is only conducted once a year, I undertake the survey each term for my own understanding of how the students are traveling. The Grade 3-6 students have completed the pen and paper survey this week I will spend the holidays crunching the results and looking at trends. Brylee is going to look at the individual results next term and work with the students who we have identified that might need some extra support (both in the way in which they approach their work and the relationships they have at school).

Class Competitions

The staff are quite a competitive group – they have set up some little competitions to determine a weekly winner. Last week's competition was to see which class had the greatest percentage of students turning up to school on time.



We were not wanting to put pressure on parents, rather trying to encourage the students to help out in the morning to get to school on time.

Congratulations to Grade 4/5, they were last week's winner. They had 97.14 percent of their students on time. I shared with School Council on Tuesday night that I was incredibly impressed with all the classes – our lowest performing class still had 88.75 percent of students getting to school on time. This is wonderful!

This week's and the first week of term 2's challenge is to be in full school uniform. This one is a little harder to judge (I am the 'uniform police' for the two weeks) as the majority of our students are in uniform or are prepared to get into uniform with the support of Mrs Michie and her spare clothes in the office.

Holiday break

If the students are feeling anything like me (tired and emotional), the holidays are a great time to reboot and recharge. Enjoy having time with your children without the stress of having to run around for school (a little trickier for those that have to work or get them off to babysitters).

Thank you for your wonderful support this term. Let's have another great term. We'll see you all on Monday April 24th

FREE Sound Scouts hearing tests

What? Sound Scouts is a fun App where children play a game (while having their hearing checked) on an iPad/tablet using a set of headphones while we supervise. A report will be automatically generated following the test which can be sent to parents/carers via email if required

When? Hearing tests will begin within the first couple of weeks of Term 2 and continue until screening is completed

Who? Grade 2 and Grade 4 children only

Why? Any hearing test results where a concern is identified, may indicate a referral to Gippsland Audiology for further testing. Parents/carers will be contacted if a referral is required. Hearing tests are encouraged due to the importance of early intervention of hearing issues. Optimal educational outcomes are dependent on good hearing!

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.






