Colour Run

What a wonderful way to end a Wednesday. Thank you to our parents that came along to support the event. I appreciate that not all parents are able to come along during the school day. Thank you also to all parents who sent along their child in a white t-shirt. For those that were unable to attend, we changed it a little bit from when we did the slime run at the beginning of the year. This time we created a course around the bottom basketball court and the three ramps we have coming off the court. This one was lower key due to it not being a major fundraiser. The three huge boxes of powder (about 50 containers) were supplied free of charge by Sport Schools Victoria. Newbee tickets

You may have heard from your child that we have relaunched our Newbee tickets in all the classrooms. We are also visiting the Newbee Shop more regularly. Students are awarded a Newbee ticket by doing various things in the classroom, depending on what the teacher is trying to get the students to focus on.

Examples of these are:

- for offering ideas during class discussions (some students/classes are reluctant to share their ideas),
- or coming quickly to sit on the floor,
- for getting on with their work quickly,
- for the younger students getting their pencil and book out by themselves.

Although these are things that all students should 'just do', we need to train them to do these things. Once the teacher notices that it is happening, they change the focus of what they are giving the Newbee tickets out for.

Recently I was in the classroom giving one to a student who used a capital letter at the beginning of their sentence. As with our process, I explained to the student what they got it for. The student sitting next to the student I was talking to, overheard what I had said, so quickly changed his sentence to make sure he had a capital letter too. When I commented on this to him, he said that he had overheard me. So, I gave him one too.

Mud Kitchen

The mud kitchen continues to be in high demand. Thank you to the parents who sent in their old/spare cooking equipment. The mud kitchen is used by all ages. It is always refreshing to see the older kids enjoying being a kid.
