School Review

The School Review is now completed. After four days of intensive investigation into how the school is tracking, the review panel has set the goals for the next four years. The next step is for these to be approved by the Department of Education, then shared with staff and school council on the 11th of July. Once this has been approved, I will be able to share them with you all. As with all schools the overarching goals are around improving learning and wellbeing, through teaching and learning, engagement, support and resources, assessment and leadership (which are the focus points of the Department's FISO 2.0 model).

Karyn Van Dyk, our School Council President, was an integral part of the review. On behalf of the school, I am incredibly thankful for Karyn's preparedness to give up two days of work to come and be a part of the panel. It is always great to get a parent's perspective of how the school is going.

Thank you also to the parents that came to the Parent Focus Group; this was a really important aspect of the review. If you have some ideas/feedback that you didn't get to share with the review team, please pass it on to any of our school council members.

Managing Outbursts

By putting this in the newsletter I have a fear that I am going to make this bigger than it really is, but I want parents to know that we are cracking down on swearing and what the consequences are. From time to time (and it really isn't very often) we have a student(s) who can get incredibly frustrated and will swear at a staff member (usually to the person who is giving them an instruction). While we appreciate that everyone can get frustrated, we can't have staff being sworn at, so any student that deliberately and purposefully swears at a staff member will be suspended.

As I said, please don't think this happens regularly, in fact it would only happen a few times a year, but I want the students, and parents/carers, to know that it is taken seriously.

Transition Sessions

We run two styles of transition sessions; socialisation days and school routine focus days.

Socialisation sessions allow the students to feel comfortable coming in the classrooms and to get a feel for how school works.

The socialisation days run from 2.15pm till 3.15pm. They are held on:

School routine focus days allow the students to undertake lessons and be a part of the normal school timetable.

The school routine days gradually increase in time, ending with full school days. The dates and times are:
